Teach na hÉireann provides services to the most vulnerable members of the Irish community living in the Coventry region and has developed from a Drop-in Centre to a registered Day Centre and Social Inclusion Centre. Open five days a week, over 25 people access the centre on a daily basis availing of a range of activities that include keep fit, Tai Chi, Irish language and IT classes. Teach na hÉireann also provides a very successful Outreach Service to older people in the Coventry area who cannot access the Day Centre.
