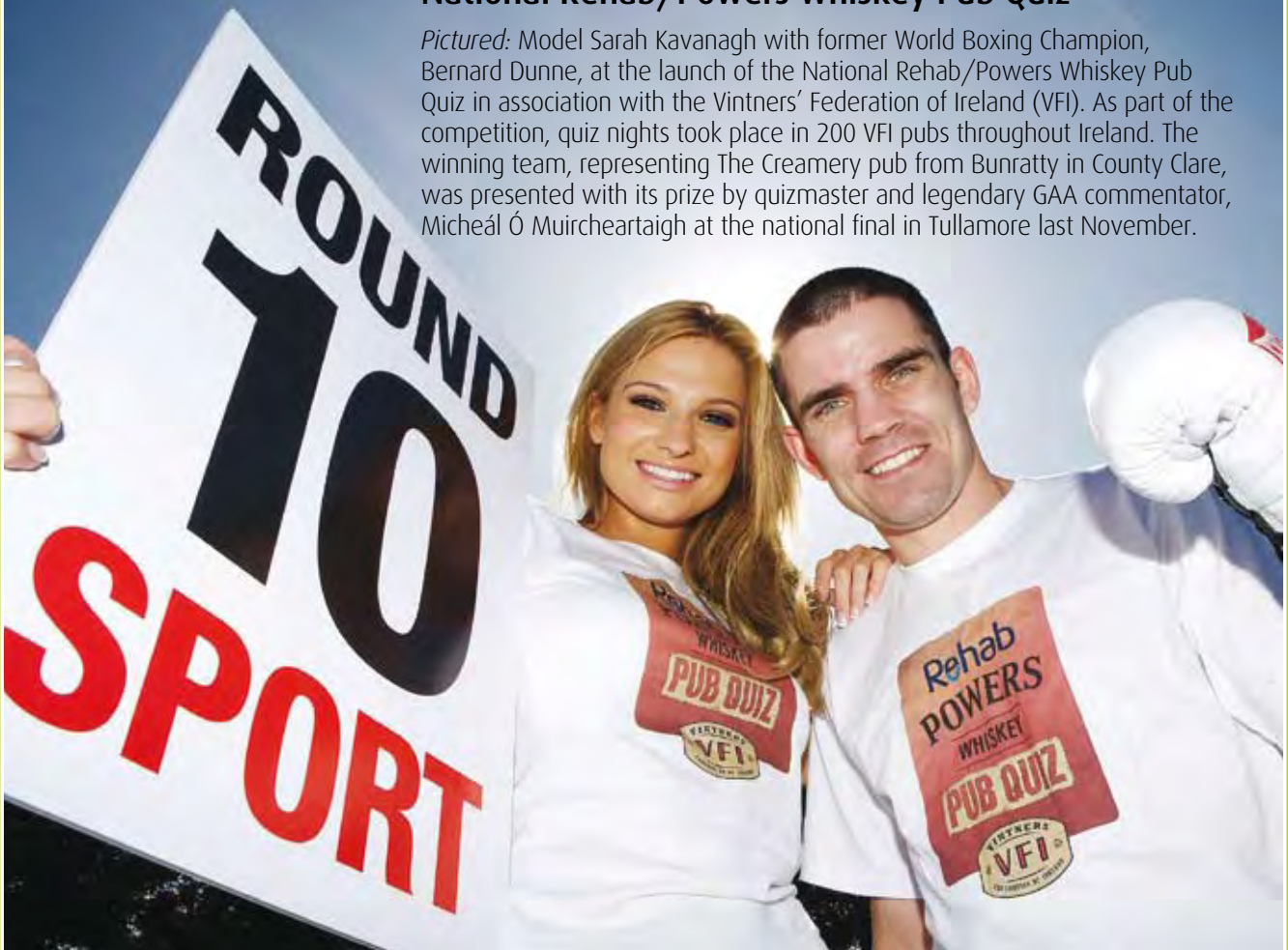
Kildare Person of the Year
