

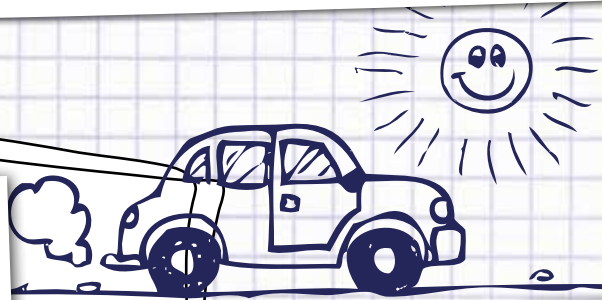
# PLEASSED TO MEET YOU
